TORTOLA

Offering the best of all worlds, the BVI's relaxed capital island features untouched natural beauty and an array of activities tucked in its 21 square miles. Spot the multimillion-dollar yachts in sheltered harbors, snorkel among brilliantly colored marine life, or simply kick back in a hammock with a rum cocktail in hand.



VIRGIN GORDA

Virgin Gorda's stunning beaches and natural wonders make it a coveted island getaway. Only a handful of villas and resorts are scattered on its 8 square miles, creating an intimate, serene atmosphere. Discover the natural bounties of this paradise island, from the enormous granite boulders of The Baths to the 260-acres national park at the summit of Gorda Peak.



JOST VAN DYKE

There are two must-dos on Jost Van Dyke: wander barefoot along the sugar-white sand and order a Painkiller at the Soggy Dollar Bar. The smallest of the four main islands, Jost Van Dyke offers breathtaking scenery with rugged, mountainous terrain and colorful coral reefs just beyond its secluded beaches. The tiny island is also home to Foxy's Tamarind Bar, world-renowned for its Old Year's Night parties, one of the biggest and best New Year's celebrations.



ANEGADA

Unlike its volcanic neighbors, Anegada's flat terrain is made of coral and limestone. Vast salt ponds covering the western end of the island are home to unique fauna, including flamingos and rock iguanas. Anegada may be the BVI's second largest island, but its proximity to the Horseshoe Reef ensures that it remains quiet and uncrowded.



NORMAN ISLAND

As legend has it, this remote little island on the southern tip of the archipelago was the inspiration for Robert Louis Stevenson's "*Treasure Island*."



COOPER ISLAND

Cooper Island is a diver's paradise, as it's adjacent to many sunken shipwrecks known affectionately as "wreck alley."



SCRUB ISLAND

Scrub Island is known for its spas and luxurious amenities as well as its extensive hiking and biking trails.



EUSTATIA ISLAND

Eustatia Island is a lush, 35-acre self-sustaining island and an exclusive sanctuary for travelers seeking to explore and relax.



GUANA ISLAND

With miles of tropical landscape, this 850-acre private island has more flora and fauna than any island its size in the Caribbean and is home to several endangered species and a private luxury resort.

Ascend Tortola's Sage Mountain for a breathtaking view of the islands scattered like jewels. On Virgin Gorda, The Baths is an astonishing collection of granite boulders and natural tide pools. Wreck divers flock to a marine national park to explore the remains of *RMS Rhone*, a sunken mail ship teeming with sea life. Jost Van Dyke invites all outdoor lovers, whether you prefer strolling barefoot along White Bay or hopping on an ATV to explore the volcanic terrain.

Hands-on classes, camps and private lessons are available from area hotels and resorts, whether you're interested in snorkeling, surfing, stand-up paddleboarding or kayaking. Additionally, many dive shops offer PADI certification courses, and once you're ready, local guides are on hand to lead you to the action.


