


## Farewell Harbour Lodge

The lodge, owned and operated by the Brockway and McGrady families, is located in Farewell Harbour on Berry Island on 10 acres of beautifully forested land. With the exception of the lodge property and 3 adjoining acreages, Berry Island is within the border of world renowned Broughton Archipelago Marine Park, which is located between Vancouver Island and the mainland of British Columbia with Queen Charlotte Strait to the west and Knight Inlet to the east. Farewell Harbour is a beautiful protected anchorage along the famed inside passage route to Alaska and we may see the twinkling anchor lights of a few yachts moored further out in the bay in the evenings. In fact, Farewell Harbour was named in 1870 by Commander Pender and officers of HMS Beaver, a Royal Navy surveying vessel. It was Commander Pender's last survey stop and his crew had 'fared well' here before also bidding 'Farewell' to the BC coast for the long journey around Cape Horn and back to England.

The primary lodge building and common area features a comfortable lounge and dining room, bar and a large brick fireplace surrounded by large windows and a wrap around deck boasting spectacular views of the harbour with its south and west exposure (great sunsets!). The expansive decks continue as a boardwalk along the shore, leading to eight, private oceanside suites with ensuite bathrooms, a cozy stove and two extra-long double size beds. A ramp leads off the main lodge to our floating accommodation featuring four additional rooms each with a private bathroom for twelve rooms in total.

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# The Great Bear Rainforest & Broughton Archipelago

In the heart of the Great Bear Rainforest at the mouth of Knight Inlet, lies an island chain called the Broughton Archipelago renowned not only for its physical beauty but also for its proximity to some of the best Orca and Grizzly viewing on the British Columbia coast. A jewel in this archipelago is Berry Island, most of which lies protected as part of a BC marine



conservation area due to its unique natural and cultural history.

Berry Island is also the home of Farewell Harbour Lodge which lies at the epicentre of one of the most biologically active regions on the coast. With eight rooms perched on a bluff at the ocean's edge overlooking picturesque



Farewell Harbour and four more rooms in our floating accommodations below, Farewell Harbour Lodge is centrally located for wildlife safaris to suit all tastes and abilities. Using our comfortable, relaxing west coast inspired lodge as our base, we make daily forays into the Great Bear Rainforest and into famed Johnstone Strait.



## Bears, Whales and First Nations Culture

In Johnstone Strait, we witness the sea teeming with wild salmon as they try and elude their mighty predator, the blackfish, or Orca, whose northern resident pods congregate in these waters from July to September as the salmon return to spawn in their natal rivers. Earlier in the spring, we seek out other marine life such as the Steller sea lion, Pacific White Sided dolphins,

Dall's porpoises and Humpback whales.

In our backyard is the southern Great Bear Rainforest with some of the most spectacular and wild rivers on the BC coast, whose wild salmon nourish the planet's largest intact temperate rainforest. A key benefactor of the annual spectacle of the salmon spawn are

the region's wild grizzly bears. The grizzlies will forage on sedge, roots and berries in the spring and summer in the broad, braided estuaries as they await the fall feast of salmon. Farewell Harbour Lodge takes guests on daily excursions into the heart of these systems in search of wild bears at home in their natural ecosystems.
